Welcome to Cedarbrook Country Club, a family-oriented facility striving to provide a total recreational and social experience, with an emphasis on golf.

Our championship golf course, situated on more than 225 acres of rolling terrain and woodlands, measures over 7,000 yards and features nine possible tee combinations, including two "PGA Family Courses". The Wissahickon Creek meanders throughout the course and combines with lakes, ponds, abundant wildlife, expansive greens, and bunkers, and two large practice areas offer a golf setting appreciated and loved by our dynamic and diverse membership.

An Olympic-sized pool, children's pool, snack bar, and six tennis courts support vibrant swimming and tennis programs for both adults and children to complete the ideal family experience.

Take part in fantastic social experiences shared with members and their families at our fun-filled events, or enjoy dining at one of several clubhouse dining areas. Cedarbrook is a full-service country club where events can be custom-tailored to meet your special needs, both at the Club facility and your home.

A sense of family and camaraderie is the cornerstone of membership at Cedarbrook Country Club. Professionals with young families, singles, and seniors alike join in creating a unique atmosphere of fellowship. Our attentive and highly-trained professional staff strives to make the member experience enjoyable and memorable.

CEDARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB HISTORY

The origins of Cedarbrook Country Club begin at the Mt. Airy Golf Club, an 18-hole course that made its debut in the late 1890s to early 1900s as the sport of golf began to gain popularity in the Philadelphia area. In 1908, the Mt. Airy Golf Club was forced to disband as its leased land became more valuable for building operations, and a large portion of the Mt. Airy membership left the Club. Nine holes of the original course remained intact and in

1909, the remaining members of Mt. Airy leased the smaller nine-hole property, formed the Stenton Country Club, and continued to play golf at this location. In 1915, nine charter members of the Stenton Country Club applied for and received a corporate charter which created the legal entity known as Stenton Country Club. The charter and the names of the nine original members are currently displayed over the fireplace in the Club's Grille Room.

Eventually, the lease was not renewed to the Stenton Country Club members for the same reasons as with Mt. Airy Golf Club, and in 1920, Stenton Country Club purchased property in Cheltenham Township with the intent to build a new 18-hole facility. The new course was designed by famed architect A.W. Tillinghast and the course and clubhouse formally

opened on July 4, 1921. Joe Seka Jr., the former golf professional at Stenton Country Club, became the first PGA Head Golf Professional at the newly formed Cedarbrook Country Club.

The Club's fortunes followed economic trends and with the help of the members, survived the precarious, prosperous 20s, the Great Depression of the 30s, and the wartime 40s. The Club played host to many local professional and amateur events through this period, highlighted by a match play competition between famed American golfing hero Gene Sarazen and reigning British Open Champion Arthur Havers in 1924; the 1925 Philadelphia Open won by Johnny Farrell; and the 1947 Philadelphia Inquirer Invitational, which saw South African Professional Bobby Locke outduel the legendary Ben Hogan during the 72-hole stroke play event. Even as the rich history of golf was being created at Cedarbrook, the property was considered so valuable that numerous attempts were made to purchase the property — by Temple University for the development of undergraduate schools and by developers to create a new baseball stadium for the Philadelphia Phillies.

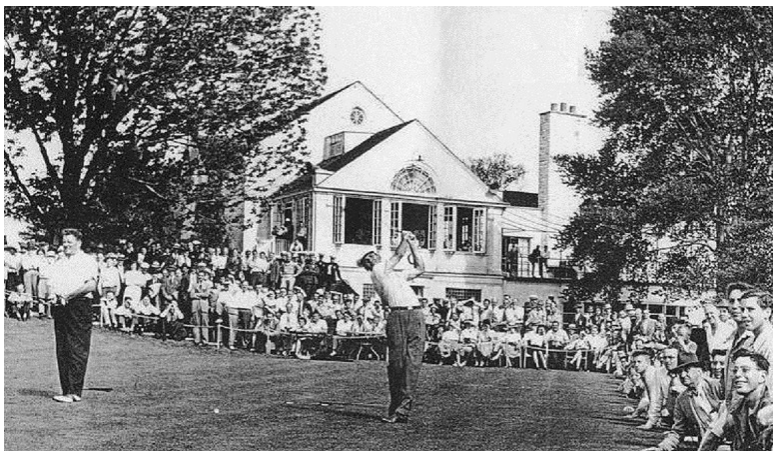

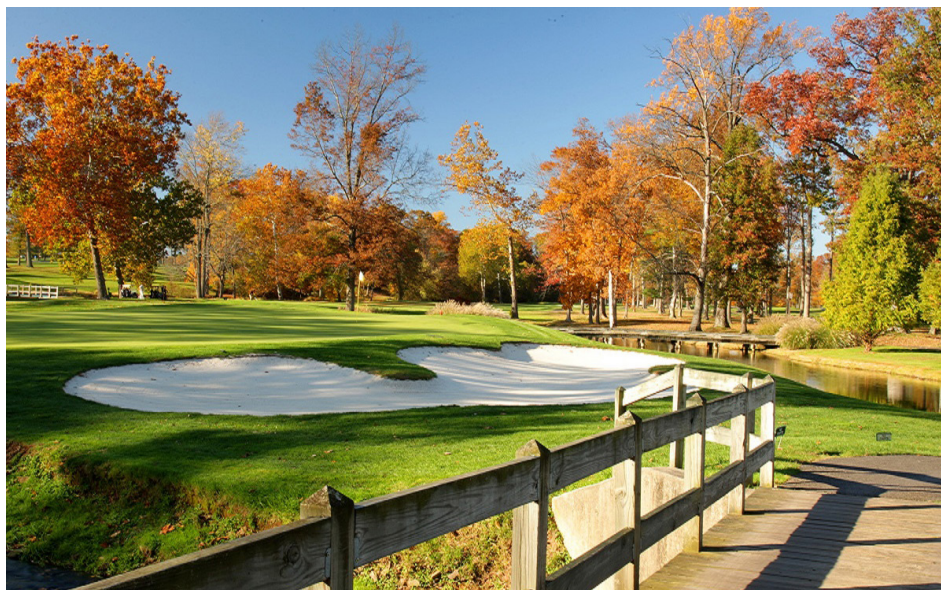
CEDARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB HISTORY

The 50s saw the city of Philadelphia begin its outward spread and a portion of Cedarbrook Country Club was taken by condemnation by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for use in the construction of the route 309 expressway. At first, consideration was given by the membership to rehabilitate the Clubhouse and redesign the remaining golf course.

However, in 1958, a resolution to sell was adopted and in 1962, Cedarbrook Country Club moved to a 210 acre tract of land in Whitpain and Gwynedd Townships. The new 18-hole facility was designed by Massachusetts' golf course architect William F. Mitchell in consultation with William F. Gordon of Doylestown, Pennsylvania.

The Cedarbrook Country Club golf course of today remains relatively unchanged from the original design, although it has been enhanced by several course renovations by the membership. The tradition of supporting the Golf Association of Philadelphia and the Philadelphia Section of the PGA by hosting many of their major golf events remains unchanged, and the strong leadership and untiring efforts of the membership continue to preserve Cedarbrook's place in the history of Philadelphia golf.

GOLF AT CEDARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB



The golf course at Cedarbrook Country Club sits on approximately 225 acres of gently rolling landscape in Blue Bell, the heart of Montgomery County, and is free from the intrusion of dissecting roadways and housing developments. Members and guests liken the experience of playing the William Mitchell design to “taking a walk in a secluded park.” Surrounded by a distinctively suburban setting, the club is easily accessible to center city Philadelphia.

The par 72 golf course is characterized by an incredible array of mature tree specimens, several large ponds and the Wissahickon Creek meandering through seven holes. The design is spacious with large, softly undulating greens that make up over four acres in total area. The Greens Superintendent and his staff take pride in presenting and maintaining high quality playing conditions daily. The course is a favorite among local golfers who enjoy the challenging design but are not overwhelmed by too severe a layout. Four permanent sets of tees combined with three “blended” tee courses provide many options to play from 5,600 yards to 7,100 yards. Two 18-Hole PGA approved and USGA rated “family courses” measuring approximately 3,000 yards and 4000 yards are available for beginning players or juniors honing their golfing skills.

The practice facilities at Cedarbrook Country Club include a 300+ yard driving range with tee areas at both ends, three short game practice greens complete with bunkering, and a large practice putting green.

GOLF AT CEDARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB

The golf program is led by PGA Professional Brad Nelson and his dedicated staff featuring several PGA Assistant Golf Professionals, a shop manager, caddy master and supporting staff. A full compliment of golf events designed for both the competitive and the social golfer is available for men, women, juniors and seniors throughout the season. Individual



instruction, group clinics and club-fitting services are supported by HUDL Technique Video Software, Trackman 4 Launch Monitor and a variety of training aids. In the off-season members continue to work on their golf games by utilizing two Indoor Golf Simulators for instruction and playing enjoyment. A full-service Golf Shop makes available the finest selection of men's, women's and junior apparel combined with a complete selection of golf equipment and accessories. A fleet of over 60 golf carts is supported by a professionally managed caddy program supervised by Caddy Master Al DeColli.

HOLE DESCRIPTIONS

Our 18-hole golf course features nine different sets of tees for men, women, and juniors including two shortened “Family Tees,” all sloped and rated by the United States Golf Association.



Hole #1

A mid-length yard par-4 with a mild dogleg right. The dogleg is bunkered on each side of the fairway and the green is well-guarded with more sand in front and to the left. The very large green contains mild sloping with a substantial elevation drop off to the back right.

Hole #2

A challenging par-5 with the meandering Wissahickon Creek bordering the left side and wrapping around behind the hole. Bunkers line the fairway and protect the front and left side of the green. The putting surface is two-tiered with a two-foot elevation change from back to front. The visual backdrop to the hole is a mature forest of varied hardwoods.

Hole #3

A difficult uphill par-4 which begins with a tee shot over water. Both sides of the hole are wooded with mature pines and there are fairway as well as greenside bunkers. The green slopes severely from left to right making it a very challenging hole from start to finish.

Hole #4

Our signature downhill par-4 with a plateau green very well-protected by a large lake. A well-placed tee shot is a must on this beautiful hole which is pictured on our scorecard. A small sloping green makes “4” a good score here.

Hole #5

A testy uphill par-3. This beautiful hole is surrounded with mature woods and is bordered on the right by a marked elevation drop. There are bunkers on both sides of the green as well as midway to the hole.

Hole #6

A dogleg right par-5 which begins with an elevated tee shot. There are multiple fairway bunkers and the green is protected by more sand and the creek to the back. The hole narrows as one approaches the green with mature pines to greet your approach shot.

Hole #7

A par-4 dogleg left with a creek immediately in front of the tee. This hole is well bunkered on both sides of the dogleg and to the left side of the green, allowing for tricky left side pin placements. This large slightly elevated green has a fall off on both sides as well as to the back. Mature trees backdrop this green and penalize golfers who are overly aggressive with their approach shots.

Hole #8

One of the most difficult par-4 holes on the golf course. Mature woods border the right side of the fairway on this difficult hole. The green is well-protected by sand and features subtle sloping which results in hazardous putting conditions.

Hole #9

A pretty par-3 that plays deceptively uphill and usually into the prevailing wind, making club selection to this sloping green very challenging. Golfers are urged to keep their ball below the hole here as downhill putts many times turn into three-putts! The clubhouse is the backdrop, reminding golfers that the first nine is close to completion.

HOLE DESCRIPTIONS

Cedarbrook has a full service Halfway House refreshment area, complete with indoor and outdoor seating and men's and women's restrooms.

Hole #10

A short but devilish par-5 that demands an accurate tee shot. A severe drop off on the left towards the creek makes any shot visiting the area usually result in a big score! A two-tiered sloping putting surface puts some teeth into a seemingly short par-5. A true “risk/reward” hole for the big hitter.

Hole #11

A straightaway par-4 bordered by mature woods along the right side and a visually intimidating creek along the entire left side of the hole. Another typically Cedarbrook sloping green is well-protected with sand and a tree overhanging on the right. Don't let the short distance fool you. This is a challenging hole.

Hole #12

A challenging par-5 dogleg to the right. Two creeks must be negotiated to complete this hole. The second creek circles to the left of this severely sloped green, giving it an island-like character. Large trees to the right of the putting surface deflect many shots from their intended target.

Hole #13

A picturesque par-3 that can play at over 200 yards. Two parallel creeks in the front of the green and a pond to the right provide the golfer with a great challenge. Mature sycamore trees frame the hole, and the large elevation change from the back of the tee to the green provides a breathtaking view.

Hole #14

This #1 rated handicap hole is plenty of par-4 for anyone! A downhill tee shot must finish short of the creek located 240 yards away, leaving the golfer with a long uphill approach. The large green is well-protected



on either side with sand, and while the putting surface appears relatively flat, don't underestimate it. Good luck!

Hole #15

After hole #14, don't let up yet! This hole is uphill, across a creek and well-bunkered with fairway and greenside sand. A successful approach shot must be accurately played to the right side of this green, allowing the ball to negotiate a severe right to the left slope. Take “4” and run to the next tee!

Hole #16

A short but difficult uphill par-3 with a severe drop off to the left. Mature woods behind the green provide another beautiful view. Possibly the most challenging green on the golf course. Keep it below the hole!

Hole #17

A par-4 with out of bounds left making another accurate tee shot a must. The right is well-bunkered and tree lined and the green is deceptively sloped left to right. Overly aggressive approach shots may find the pond to the right.

Hole #18

A gorgeous finishing dogleg left par-4. Your final tee shot of the day must land safely between two fairway bunkers and the approach is to one of the largest putting surfaces on the course. Enjoy sinking that final putt and make your way to the clubhouse for a well-deserved beverage of your choice!

DINING AT CEDARBROOK COUNTRY CLUB

Dining at Cedarbrook Country Club features an array of dining experiences, from a comfortable family setting to quiet and intimate dining. Our four main dining areas offer distinct and varied atmospheres for the enjoyment of our members and their guests.

Our recently renovated **Grille Room** provides a beautiful view across the 1st and 10th tees and the practice putting green. This room offers informal and social dining enjoyed by golfers coming right off the course, members looking to mingle at the bar with friends, or families looking for comfortable dining. The Patio located right off the Grille Room is a popular place for outdoor dining in spring, summer, and fall, with easy access to a firepit shared by many for a leisurely “after dinner” drink.



The **Cedarbrook Room**, while still offering a relaxed dining experience, offers more privacy. The Cedarbrook Room seats up to 30 for à la carte dining and is a perfect venue for members entertaining small groups for breakfast, lunch, or dinner.

For those looking to host small to medium sized private parties, the **Members’ Front Dining Room** provides a more formal ambiance. There is a sunken bar dedicated solely for service in the Members’ Front Dining Room, a fireplace providing warmth, and a player piano to entertain with soft tunes for the evening. A terrace off the Members’ Front Dining Room has a delightful view of the 18th green and can be utilized by larger groups for outdoor but protected dining and occasional à la carte lunch and dinner service.



The Club’s **Grand Ballroom** is ideal for larger functions. Weddings, anniversary parties, and special functions, member or member-sponsored, can enjoy a beautiful view of the golf course from the Grand Ballroom which can accommodate up to 180 people with a dance floor and up to 220 people without. The Grand Ballroom is the setting for our much-celebrated Grand Sunday and Holiday Brunches that take place throughout the season.

In addition to our clubhouse dining settings, the Club’s Poolside Bar and Snack Bar is a very popular place for families to enjoy quick and easy meals during the summer. While the Pool Snack Bar offers very casual selections, members may always order from the Grille Room menu and have their selections delivered to the pool for their enjoyment.

On the golf course, the Club’s Halfway House provides the perfect break between “nines” for a variety of food and beverage refreshment.

CEDARBROOK TENNIS, SWIMMING, & SUMMER CAMP

Cedarbrook Country Club, while rich in golf history, has much more to offer those in search of additional athletic activities. The Tennis Program at Cedarbrook, led by USPTR Tennis Professional Dale Taylor and her team of qualified teaching professionals, provides a full complement of tournaments and instruction for men, women, and juniors. The tournament schedule includes both competitive and social events for the most skilled player, intermediate player, and beginners alike, and our four hard courts and two Har-Tru courts provide our membership with the finest playing surfaces available. The four hard courts are lit and available for nighttime tennis. Pickle Ball, a new and hugely popular racquet sport has come to Cedarbrook as well with weekly instruction and competition available.



The Cedarbrook Swim Program utilizes a six lane, 25-meter competition pool with a newly installed Pool Slide and a separate baby pool. The pool provides hours of summer fun for adults and children alike. Our certified and trained professional staff offer both private and group swimming instruction, as well as coaching and supervision of the Cedarbrook Serpent Junior Swim Team. The swim team participates in the Country Club Swimming Association Swim League and competes in multiple dual

meets and League Championships during the months of June and July. Whether swimming competitively or just for a relaxing evening swim after work, our membership is kept refreshed by the great selection of food and drink at the Pool Grill Bar.

Cedarbrook Country Club also provides a Summer Camp experience for children and grandchildren of the members. Children engage in a diverse group of activities extending from board games, arts and crafts, field trips, and much more. Each week children receive coaching in golf, tennis, and swimming, and engage in other physical activities set up by fun and experienced counselors. Cedarbrook Summer Camp provides kids with a fun and physical alternative to spending the summer at home and offers flexibility that allows campers to participate in other summer programs such as junior golf, tennis team, and swim team. Summer Camp is available from the middle of June to early August and can be utilized weekly, daily, or half-day for the convenience of the membership.

MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATIONS

Cedarbrook Country Club has a wide array of memberships tailored to your individual needs. Golf memberships are available offering various options of playing privileges for individuals and families, while House or House with Pool & Tennis memberships cover those interested mainly in the social and dining aspects of the club. Intermediate memberships in both Golf and House categories offer reduced annual dues for those under the age of 40.

ACTIVE GOLF

Provides unlimited golf, Club, pool and tennis privileges for the member and Club, pool, and tennis privileges for immediate family. Children aged 12 and under receive golf privileges as outlined in the Club's Golf Rules & Regulations.

ACTIVE FAMILY GOLF

Provides all privileges described above, plus golf privileges for immediate family as outlined in the Club's Golf Rules & Regulations.

ACTIVE GOLF + ONE

Provides all privileges described under Active Golf, plus golf privileges amounting to 12 18-hole rounds annually, for the spouse of the member.

ACTIVE GOLF + LEGACY IN WAITING

Provides all privileges described under Active Golf, plus golf privileges amounting to 15 18-hole rounds annually for children aged 21-25 who are in the workforce but living more than 100 miles from parents' legal residence. Available for a maximum of two years.

ACTIVE GOLF + JUNIOR ADD ON

Provides all privileges described under Active Golf, plus golf privileges for children aged 13-18 (or up to 23 who are attending college and living at home) as outlined in the Club's Golf Rules & Regulations.

INTERMEDIATE GOLF

Available to individuals between the ages of 21 and 39 and provides all the privileges described under Active Golf. Reduced annual dues are available in the age groups of 21-24, 25-29, 30-34, and 35-39.

INTERMEDIATE FAMILY GOLF

Available to individuals between the ages of 25 and 39 and provides all the privileges described under Active Family Golf. Reduced annual dues are available in the age groups of 25-29, 30-34, and 35-39.

INTERMEDIATE GOLF + ONE

Available to individuals between the ages of 21 and 39 and provides all privileges described under Active Golf + One. Reduced annual dues are available in the age groups of 21-24, 25-29, 30-34, and 35-39.

MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATIONS

HOUSE

Provides full use of Club dining facilities and participation in Club social events for the member and immediate family. Golf privileges amounting to six 18-hole rounds during the “Golf Season” with payment of a partial guest fee, and unlimited golf privileges in the “Off-Season” with payment of a partial guest fee, are available for the member. Additional golf privileges may be available on an annual basis determined by the Golf Committee. The spouse of a House Member may play six 18-hole rounds annually with payment of a guest fee.

HOUSE WITH POOL & TENNIS

Provides all privileges described under House Membership, plus pool and tennis privileges to the member and immediate family.

INTERMEDIATE HOUSE

Available to individuals between the ages of 21 and 39 and provides all the privileges described under House. Reduced annual dues are available in the age groups of 21-34 and 35-39.

INTERMEDIATE HOUSE POOL & TENNIS

Available to individuals between the ages of 21 and 39 and provides all the privileges described under House with Pool & Tennis. Reduced annual dues are available in the age groups of 21-34 and 35-39.

NON-RESIDENT GOLF

Available to individuals aged 21 or older who permanently reside more than 100 miles from the Club and do not have an additional in-season residence within 100 miles of the Club.

Provides golf privileges amounting to 12 18-hole rounds annually (six rounds included with dues payment and six rounds with guest fee payment) for the member. Additional golf privileges may be available on an annual basis determined by the Golf Committee. Member and immediate family receive Club, pool, and tennis privileges.

JUNIOR GOLF AFFILIATE

Available to children between the ages of 13 and 18 (or up to age 23 if attending college and living at home) whose parents are not golf members. Provides golf privileges as outlined in the Club’s Golf Rules & Regulations and full use of Club dining facilities.

Active + 1 – Adds (12) rounds of golf for spouse.

Active + Legacy – Adds (15) rounds of golf for working child.

House – Can play up to (6) rounds of paid golf in season. Unlimited paid rounds out of season

House P&T – Can play up to (6) rounds of paid golf in season. Unlimited paid rounds out of season.

Membership dues may be paid in four equal installments due on 12/31, 1/31, 2/28 and 3/31 with an installment fee of \$50.00 each month. Anyone joining the club after July 1 will be charged one half of the yearly dues as well as the Golf Activity, Bag Storage and Locker fees.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is Cedarbrook Country Club's position on member diversity?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club membership is open to people of all races, religious backgrounds, and ethnicity.

Q: If I have a specific question as to a rule or policy at Cedarbrook Country Club, who do I ask?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club staff members are available to answer both rules and policy questions. The key personnel to check with are the Club Manager for any house questions, the Director of Membership for membership concerns, the Golf Professional for any golf operation questions, the Golf Course Superintendent for any questions pertaining to the golf course maintenance, and the Club Controller or Office Administrative Assistant for any billing questions. The Club's Board of Governors is published on the website. These members as well as your sponsoring member are happy to entertain questions or comments you may have.

Q: Is there a dress code for the clubhouse and the golf course?

A: Yes. Cedarbrook Country Club adheres to the traditional dress code for both the clubhouse and the golf course. Details of the dress code are available in the Club's rules and regulations, which can be found on the website, www.cedarbrookcc.org.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club have a cell phone policy?

A: Cell phones must be on vibrate while on the clubhouse property and golf course. Cell phone conversations are permitted only in the locker rooms or outside the clubhouse.

Q: Is there a time that I can pay with cash for products or services I receive at the Club?

A: All food/beverage charges incurred at the Club must be charged to your house account. Cash may be used for gratuities to staff members. Purchases in the Golf Shop may be charged to your house account or paid for with cash or credit card.

Q: Is smoking prohibited in the clubhouse?

A: Yes. Smoking is prohibited in the clubhouse with the exception of the Men's Locker Room. Smoking is permitted only on the golf course and practice facilities, the golf staging area adjacent to the bag room, the fire pit adjacent to the Terrace Patio, and the Terrace Patio when no dining event is taking place.

Q: Is "tipping" permitted at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: Yes. Gratuities are permitted and appreciated by the starter/caddy master, assistant golf professionals, locker room attendants, wait staff and bartenders.

Q: When does the Club open and close?

A: Clubhouse and dining hours of operations change seasonally. Specific daily availability can be obtained on the Club website or by calling the Business Office at 215-646-9410.

Q: How early can I start playing golf and how late can I play?

A: During the golf season, the golf course opens for play at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday and at 7:00 a.m. on weekends and holidays. Members must check in with the caddy master before beginning play. Members must return all golf carts to the staging area by dusk.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the procedure for getting paired up at the Club?

A: You may call the Golf Shop to advise them you are coming and would like to play. The caddy master/starter controls all play and makes every effort to pair players of similar playing ability, or special requests. Upon arriving at the Club, always check in with the caddy master/starter to let him know you have arrived and when you would like to play.

Q: Does Cedarbrook utilize starting times?

A: Starting times are not required for play during the week or on weekends before 10:30 a.m. The starter controls play on a first come/first serve basis. For weekend play after 10:30 a.m., members must call the Golf Shop on the previous Thursday morning after 8:30 a.m. to reserve starting times.

Q: How do I establish a handicap at the Club?

A: The Golf Association of Philadelphia administers the handicapping system through the World Handicap system and records are constantly updated between April 1 and November 15. If you have a handicap established at another Club, the Golf Shop will arrange to have those records transferred to Cedarbrook's handicap system. If you have no previous handicap, the Golf Shop will enter you into the handicap system and you can immediately begin posting your scores. During the golf season, members must post all scores in the handicap computer. Scores may be entered into your records in the off-season through the internet.

Q: Must I take a cart and/or caddy or may I carry my own bag?

A: During the golf season, members must take a cart and/or caddy before 2:00 p.m. After 2:00 p.m. members are permitted to carry their own bag. During the off season (November 1 through March 31), members may carry their own bag any time. Cedarbrook Country Club has an active caddy program ranging from very experienced caddies to beginners. You may call ahead or request a caddy from the caddy master upon arriving to the Club.

Q: May I bring guests to play golf anytime during the week?

A: Yes. Members may bring guests during the week with restrictions pertaining to Men's Day and Ladies' Day and limited restrictions on weekends and holidays.

Q: Are there times during the week when guest fees are reduced so members can expose the Club to friends, clients, or prospective members at a lesser price?

A: Yes. Guest fees are reduced from \$85.00 per guest to \$55.00 per guest Tuesday through Sunday after 2:00 p.m. The Club also adjusts guest fees to off-season rates from November 1 through March 31.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club have an active tournament schedule?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club has tournament programs consisting of individual and team events for men, women, seniors, and juniors. The tournament schedules are posted on the website and in the locker rooms. Sign up sheets in the locker rooms are posted approximately 4-6 weeks before the tournament, or members can sign up for most tournaments on the website. The Golf Shop is happy to find partners for new members desiring to play in tournaments.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What type of golf practice facilities are available at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club has one of the largest practice facilities in the region consisting of a driving range with hitting tees at both ends of the range, three chipping greens with bunkers, and a large practice putting green. The practice facilities are available all year, weather permitting. Unlimited range balls are available on the practice tee and at both short game areas. All golfing members are charged a flat range fee in the beginning of the golf season to cover the cost of range privileges for the year. House members may also gain range privileges by notifying the Golf Shop and paying the normal annual range fee.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club have any indoor practice facilities?

A: In the off season, Cedarbrook Country Club has two indoor golf simulators available to the membership for play, practice, instruction, and club-fitting services. Men's and women's golf leagues take place during the winter months.

Q: There is a fully stocked Golf Shop on the Club's grounds. Is that owned by the Club or the golf professional?

A: The Golf Shop is a business owned and financed by our PGA Head Golf Professional Brad Nelson. It is a major part of the compensation package provided to him by the membership. Members are strongly encouraged to support his Golf Shop for their golfing needs.

Q: What type of golf instruction is offered?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club has several golf instructors on staff led by PGA Head Golf Professional Brad Nelson and Director of Instruction John King. They offer a wide variety of camps and clinics as well as individual instruction. They utilize a wide range of teaching tools including video, ball launch monitors, and several club-fitting systems.

Q: In addition to my annual dues, are there other golf-related fees?

A: Yes. All golfing members are charged a golf activity fee, bag storage fee, and driving range fee at the beginning of each golf season. All members (golf and house) are billed a monthly capital assessment fee ranging from \$25.00–\$50.00 depending on membership level.

Q: What golfing privileges are available for House members?

A: House members are permitted six rounds of golf during the golf season upon paying the appropriate greens fee. During the off-season, House members may play unlimited golf by paying the appropriate greens fee. Annually the Golf Committee reviews levels of play on the golf course and playing privileges may be offered to House members in addition to those listed above. House members may bring guests with limited restrictions listed in the Club's rules and regulations. House members are permitted to play in some Cedarbrook Country Club golf tournaments at the approval of the Golf Chairman.

Q: My son/daughter is an accomplished golfer. At what time may he/she play golf with me on the weekends?

A: The Junior Golf Program at Cedarbrook Country Club has a system of "certifying" accomplished junior players. "Certified Junior Golfers" are subject to playing restrictions but may play WITH their parents after 10:30 a.m. on weekends and holidays. Playing times for both "Certified Junior Golfers" and "Uncertified Junior Golfers" are listed in the Club's rules and regulations.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Are there sports and social programs available for my children?

A: Yes. Cedarbrook Country Club has extensive programs in golf, swim, and tennis for children of all ages. A summer camp is also available for younger children age 5-11. Other social activities include Breakfast with the Easter Bunny, Halloween Party with Hayride & Haunted House, July 4th Summer Carnival, and other Holiday Weekend activities.

Q: What is involved in the Cedarbrook Country Club Junior Golf Program?

A: Junior Golf Program details are listed in our annual Junior Golf Booklet as well as on the Club website. The program includes junior clinics and camps and weekly playing opportunities for junior golfers. Other special events include a Parent/Child Tournament, Junior Club Championships, PGA Drive, Chip & Putt Competitions, PGA Junior Golf League, and the year-end Junior Sports Banquet.

Q: Are my children permitted to invite friends to play golf, tennis, or swim?

A: Yes. Children are permitted to invite guests to the Club within the guidelines of the Club's rules and regulations. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their children and will be expected to provide supervision when younger children are involved.

Q: Are there locker room attendants?

A: Yes. Cedarbrook Country Club employs locker room attendants in both men's and women's locker rooms during the golf season. The locker room attendants assign lockers and provide both golf and street shoe cleaning and shining services. Guest lockers are available as well. Members and their guests are expected to utilize the locker rooms for changing shoes. Changing shoes in the parking lot is not permitted.

Q: What type of dining options are available at the Club?

A: There are several dining areas in the clubhouse:

- Grille Room & Grille Patio: A more casual atmosphere for lunch, cocktails after golf, or dinner overlooking the practice putting green and 10th tee.
- Cedarbrook Room: Available for both à la carte and small group lunch and dinner affairs.
- Member Front Dining Room and Terrace: Utilized for special meetings and parties and occasionally for member dining with a fabulous view of the 18th green.
- Grand Ballroom: Used for large member functions and large outside weddings and events.

Q: Are catering services offered both at the club and at private residences?

A: Cedarbrook Country Club is a full-service country club where events can be custom tailored to meet your special needs both at the Club facility or at your home. Catering menus can be found on the Club website and our catering manager and staff welcome the opportunity to work with you to make your event special and memorable.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Am I responsible for a “food minimum” during the year and if so, how does it work?

A: Yes. Each member, depending on membership classification, is responsible for a quarterly food minimum up to \$350.00. The quarterly food minimum includes all food purchased in any of the Club’s dining facilities in the clubhouse, on the golf course, and at the pool. Beverages are not included in the food minimum. Members may view their food minimum status at any time by logging onto the Club’s website, or reviewing the bottom of their monthly bill.

Q: Do I need to make reservations when coming to the Club to dine?

A: Reservations are always recommended when coming to the Club for à la carte breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Reservations are mandatory for special functions such as Sunday Brunch or Holiday Dinners.

Q: Are jeans and hats permitted in the clubhouse?

A: Dress jeans are permitted in the clubhouse. Hats must be removed in all dining areas but may be worn in the locker rooms.

Q: When does the pool open for the season and what are the hours of operation?

A: The pool is open on weekends from Memorial Day to mid-June. After opening full time, it remains open daily from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. through Labor Day. Weather permitting, the pool remains open on weekends in September.

Q: May I reserve the pool for a private party?

A: Yes. Private parties are welcome at the pool. Please contact the Club’s pool director and catering manager for more information.

Q: May my children attend the pool unsupervised?

A: Yes. Children age 12 and older may swim at the pool unsupervised. Children under the age of 12 must have adult supervision.

Q: Are guests permitted at the pool?

A: Yes. Pool members may bring guests at any time during the hours of operation. Guest fees are \$6.00 per guest.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club have a Junior Swim Team?

A: Yes. The Cedarbrook Swim Team, The Serpents, is a fun and competitive team for all ages and abilities. The team is made up of juniors age 4 through 18. The team competes in the Country Club Swimming Association and has dual meets during June and July. The season culminates with league championships in late summer.

Q: Are swimming lessons available at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: Yes. The pool offers private swimming lessons for members of all abilities and beginner group lessons.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Is there a summer camp available at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: Cedarbrook Summer Camp is available for children age 5-11. The camp runs from mid-June into early August and is available for children and grandchildren of all members. The camp hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday and children may attend all weeks or for single weeks. Extended hours after camp are available.

Q: How many tennis courts are available at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: The Club has four hard courts and two Har Tru (Clay) courts.

Q: Are the courts available at any time for recreational play?

A: Most weekday mornings, the courts are reserved for instruction and team competition. Most afternoons and evenings are available for recreational play. The four hard courts are lighted and available after dark. Members are encouraged to check the weekly tennis schedule available on the website.

Q: Are there Club-sponsored tennis events?

A: Yes. In March, a Tennis Calendar is posted with all the events for both adults and juniors. On the calendar are events such as Friday Night Mixers, Ladies' Round Robins, Member/Member or Member/Guest Tournaments, Parent/Child Tournaments, Kid Appreciation Day, and Pro-Am Tournaments.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club field tennis teams?

A: Yes. Cedarbrook has several ladies' tennis teams, inter-club teams and one USTA team. There are also girls and boys inter-club U18 tennis teams.

Q: What tennis instructional opportunities are available at Cedarbrook Country Club?

A: Daily and weekend private lessons and clinics are both available for beginning players to advanced players. Junior clinics are held from April through October, and there are also 12 weeks of Summer Tennis Camps.

Q: Does Cedarbrook Country Club have any other outdoor sport activities available?

A: Cedarbrook has two outdoor bocce courts available for use by the members. The Cedarbrook Bocce Summer League and Fall League are both co-ed and take place annually. The tennis courts may also be converted into Pickle Ball courts for use by the members.
